Repeater Report

Hello to all you repeater users, it's that time again when with settled warm weather and daylight saving the yearly maintenance and site improvements can be recommenced at the repeater site.

Morrie ZL2ADP and myself (ZL2TNG) paid the Climie repeater site a quick visit to check out the repeaters as well as to bring us up to speed on what work is required to be done.

The main task will be to get the heliax cable connected to the north sited antennas, this will include pulling several cables through the already laid ducting and terminating them in the huts. Unfortunately this work was not completed before the winter weather set in. We hope to also include power and communication cables between the sites. Several of the repeater cabinets need to be secured in case of an earthquake. Some minor repairs to the old hut as well as rust prevention is required. All in all interesting rather than heavy work. We will let you know the day and date of the working bee very soon.

A small group interested in developing and setting up a 23cm repeater are busily putting together a proposal/system. If you want to be involved you can contact Jens ZL2TJT. One spin-off from having a repeater in this band is the opportunity for a club project constructing a converter for yourself so as your 2meter or 70 cm transceiver would be able to access the repeater. Building what are small antennas for this higher band is a lot of fun and is not costly.

Peter ZL2HM one of our repeater trustees is in Haiti working for the Red Cross installing emergency communications equipment. The country suffered severe cyclone and flood damage. A very good article appears in the latest Break-in outlining what Peter is to be doing and his training regime.

Apart from some minor interference on 730 and possibly a tone on 860 the repeaters have performed very well over the winter months. The 730 interference has been attended too, the possible tone on 860, not easily heard on most sets, will be investigated at some stage.
