Repeater Report

Just a short report this month. Yes, 860 is down due to a fault in the receiver module causing it to lock on transmit. Whilst we (John ZL2TWS and Neil ZL2TNG) were attending to the 860 repeater we investigated the spurious noises on the 730 repeater.

Several possible causes were found, a T connector touching the cavity filters as well as a slightly loose antenna connector. All the plugs and sockets were given a cursory wiggle and the final cabinet vibration test proved the success of the operation.

It was also apparent that in windy weather we had some bearing on other interference, a search of the site turned up a fault with an unused 2-meter ½ wave ground-plane antenna, the quick removal of the coax seemed to cure this problem.


