Branch 63 Repeater Update - November

1292 23cm RF Deck Progress ! A 23cm duplexer was purchased from duplexers.eu by John ZL2TWS.



This type of duplexer uses a notch type filtering arrangement and exposed a design flaw with the rf deck of the repeater. The Problem is that the transmit side of the RF deck is wideband Amplifying everything over a 300 MHz band. The new duplexer passes all frequencies that are outside its notch frequency so All the rf noise was being coupled from the tx port to the receiver causing de sensing. The solution was to fit a narrow band-pass filter in between the pre-driver and final PA module. This cured the problem.

A Mount for the Antenna has been fabricated and the antenna glued in place.

The repeater was temporary installed up at Climie to check the antenna and rack. Coverage was good.

The 860 single dipole antenna was replaced over the weekend with the new colinear made by John ZL2TWS, performance is excellent 3 to 4 S points up over the dipole, however as we were about to leave we discovered a problem with the Tait receiver and a suspect coax connector meaning another site visit is planned to investigate. 860 may be off the air for a while as problems are sorted out.
