Repeaters

1292 23cm FM Repeater

As reported in the previous issue 1292 is back on air with an antenna design called a "Hentenna" and a pair connected in parallel. The Hentenna is a loop antenna predominantly made for 6 metres and looks a bit like the driven element of a skeleton slot. The Antenna is predominantly Horizontal in polarization so remote users may possibly need to reconfigure their 1292 antenna systems to access the repeater.

860 & 5425 D-Star Repeaters

On Thursday 28 February 2013, John ZL2TWS and Gerry ZL2TDN installed a new four dipole stack on Climie 860 D-Star. The previous antenna was working well until water got into the connector and feed line causing a loss of performance. The new antenna, from recent reports has made a huge improvement for most users of D-Star and is evident by the good signal reports received to date.

730 2m FM Repeater

At a recent Club meeting it was decided to purchase a new four dipole stack from the same source as the 860 antenna array. This new dipole stack will be installed for use on 730 with the refurbished 4 dipole stack used on the 5425 repeater.

6m FM Repeater

Special IRLP Event: Sunday 17 March 8.30 am – on IRLP Node 6931

In 2003, the Mayor of Upper Hutt Wayne Guppy, and then current President of NZART Peter Norden ZL2SJ and members of Upper Hutt Branch 63 NZART celebrated with Wellington Florida's city councillor Bob Margolis the anniversary of the founding of Wellington Florida's Emergency Communications Management Centre. This link up was done via IRLP a VOIP linking system. The two men exchanged greetings and best wishes to each other over a period of some thirty minutes. Both were amazed at the technology involved the various matters in common they both had.



This year 2013, Wellington Florida's Amateur Radio Club again made contact with Upper Hutt Branch 63 to again renew this communication, but this time with the mayors of Wellington Florida and Wellington New Zealand. Bob Margolis now mayor of Wellington Florida and Wellington's mayor Celica Wade-Brown were due to have a similar link up to the one described above. However due to a scheduling conflict Mayor Wade-Brown had to decline the request with a week to go.

Larry Lazar KS4NB President of the Wellington Radio Club (Florida) made contact with President of Upper Hutt

Branch 63 to request assistance to arrange an alternative for Mayor Wade-Brown. It was thought that ten years after their first contact the two Mayors from Wellington Florida and Upper Hutt would like to renew their friendship.

Upper Hutt Branch 63 readily offered to step in and make this QSO happen.

The event went ahead on Sunday 17 March 8.30 am – via IRLP Node 6931 on the Mt Climie 730 VHF Repeater.

Both mayors again exchanging greetings and Mayor Guppy relived his time in America where he studied for his PhD, at the University of Nebraska commenting on the recent poor performance of his beloved American Football team from the university. The team is known by its nickname the Cornhuskers has fallen on hard times but he is hoping that it will return and perform better in the future. Comments were also given about the status of the drought here in New Zealand, which Mayor Margolis stated that they too had similar events; wishing all Wellingtonians good luck for rain in the near future. Oddly enough the rain started just after the QSO finished so perhaps the 'rain Gods' were listening.

Within fifteen minutes it was all over and the node and repeater were returned to normal operation.

I'd like to thank Larry, and both mayors for making the effort to be involved in the event, and making it such a success, and to also thank Wellington Branch 50 NZART and current NZART President Vaughan Henderson ZL1TGC for their assistance in the early planning stages.

We all hope to be around in another ten years to perhaps repeat the link up and who knows via what technology amateur radio will have explored at that time.

Runners, Racing, Radio and Ruddy Flies!

..... or a few words about this year's Southern Crossing race.

This year's race, also known as the Tararua Mountain Race (or TMR), took place on Saturday 09 March, the runners starting at the YMCA Camp Kaitoke (ex - Kiwi Ranch). The details for the race can be found at <http://www.tararua-race.org.nz/> however the basic idea is that these deranged super fit people run from Kaitoke over the Tararua range to Otaki Forks, taking anywhere between 5½ and 10 hours (-ish) to complete the course. It is treated as a Search and Rescue (SAR) exercise unless it becomes 'real'.

Gavin ZL2ACT and Eric ZL2SET attended the SAR briefing at Wellington Central Police Station on Monday 04 March. Fortunately it was 'briefer' (excuse the pun) than the previous time Branch 63 was involved. Our instructions were to operate the communications site at the start (Kaitoke), ensuring that all runners left OK and to remain until the organisers were certain that everyone had passed Alpha Hut and were not going to turn back.

As things turned out, the start (callsign 'TMR Start') was a single operator station, ZL2SET using the supplied SAR radio, working through the SAR repeater (channel ESB7) on Climie. The station was set up and running from Eric's car by 0545 hrs and continued until stand-down at 1245 hrs (or was it 1345 hrs? – forgot to put it into the informal log). The weather was good for running, although the wind 'up top' was a little brisk.

Basically, there were no issues, the 90 runners starting every 30 minutes from 0630 hrs until 0930 hrs. No lost runners, no broken limbs, no reasons to call the rescue chopper. All went smoothly. This meant that the last few hours involved very little radio traffic and was really fairly boring!

The only thing that kept the operator's interest in the last half of the time was trying to work out ways to get away from the myriads of sand flies that frequented the grass outside the gymnasium (operating position) at Kaitoke camp. They attacked outside the car and invaded the vehicle every time a window or door was opened. The fly repellent must be remembered in future – it was forgotten this time.
