Only one call out this month which had me awake at 0530 on a chilly Saturday morning. The missing person had been reported absent from home since 10 pm the day before and was reportedly very lightly clad. Field teams and me were to report to the Wainuiomata rural fire station.

I set up the staging area inside the station and the Comms plan had us using the Crowther repeater with close in comms being on the default simplex channel. We waited and waited for further instructions and just as the tasking sheets began to be delivered at 0930 the missing person was found safe. "Stand down".

This was a good but frustrating outcome for all who turned out. The delay in getting us started was due to changes in information coming through from the family. Its tough getting a big turn out early on a Saturday morning but it was pleasing to see how many hardy souls there

really are in Wellington LandSAR. AREC is helping to introduce the Sartrack package as the new SAR operational programme and we now use it on every search for a permanent record.

Our new Tait handhelds come with GPS included (like the Icom DSTAR ID51) and eventually the positions of all teams who carry these radios will be tracked by auto generated position data providing the Incident Control with instant coverage maps and reducing the necessity for Field Teams to stop and provide position reports in the terrible conditions that searches are often carried out in.
