


# **ZL2VH Newsletter – July 2019**

#### **Status Updates**

3cm Beacon On – Air (soon again ).

At the beginning of June the beacon was put back on Air. However, after a report from Christchurch that it was off air— proof that it is fulfilling a function, A trip up Climie was made to investigate. Initial thoughts were that the r.f. head had developed a fault but, in the end, the reason was much simpler. - A corroded waterlogged DC connector in the South Hut. Unfortunately we didn't take a soldering iron along so another trip is planned shortly to investigate the waterlogged cable and hopefully the beacon will be back on air soon.


